There are beautiful walking trails that wind through the lush tropical forest of Victoria Peak Garden. The Peak Tower (an architectural icon in its own right) has a 360° viewing platform and offers a variety of restaurants and shops.

Get to The Peak on the Peak Tram - originally built in 1888. This 7-minute scenic ride offers a uniquely spectacular perspective of the city.

Hong Kong Disneyland

Lantau Island, Hong Kong, China

Nearest station: MTR: Hung Hom
Attractions

A 310-acre amusement park with a

fabulous range of rides and adventures in four themed parks (Main Street USA, Fantasyland, Adventureland and Tomorrowland). This is where the big kid in us all can be unleashed!

Located on Lantau Island. The best way to get there is on the MTR from Central (30 minutes). A supporter of the LGBT community, HK Disneyland hosts 'Gay Day Disneyland' every year.

Big Buddha at Po Lin Monastery

Lantau Island, Hong Kong, China

Attractions

At 34 metres high, this is the world's tallest outdoor seated bronze Buddha image. It is located at the Po Lin Monastery on Lantau Island.

The Monastery dates from 1924 and features a number of interesting temples and other structures. The Big Buddha (Tian Tan Buddha) is open to the general public between 10am-5:30pm.

The quickest way to get to Po Lin Monastery is via the Ngong Ping cable car outside the Tung Chung MTR Station (25 minutes and an additional 10 minutes' walk to the Monastery).

A Symphony of Lights

Victoria Harbour, Hong Kong, China

Attractions

The world's largest permanent light and

laser show featuring 44 buildings on both sides of Victoria Harbour.

A Symphony of Lights show is held every night at 8pm and lasts about 14 minutes.

Nan Lian Garden

60 Fung Tak Rd, Diamond Hill, Hong Kong, China

Attractions

Opened in 2006, this beautiful Chinese garden in Tang Dynasty style is located in Diamond Hill, Kowloon. It covers an area of 3.5 hectares and features hills, rocks and wooden structures.

Nan Lian Garden offers a peaceful retreat from the city. Open daily from 7am to 9pm. Free entry.

Hong Kong Museum of History

100 Chatham Rd South, Tsim Sha Tsui East, Hong Kong, China

Attractions

This museum (opened 1975) showcases Hong Kong's historical cultural heritage through 8 galleries with over 4,000 exhibits, enhanced with special audio-visual and lighting effects.

The exhibition tells the story from the Devonian period 400 million years ago and concludes with the reunification of Hong Kong with China in 1997.

Located Cheong Wan Road in Kowloon. Closed on Tuesdays.
